The 2nd Sunday of Easter sees us, every year, listening to the Gospel story of Thomas' wonderful confession of faith: 'My Lord and my God'.

It emerged in the meeting of Jesus' with them on the Sunday after Easter Day. While others were sharing the amazing news encounter with the Risen Lord, Thomas, who hadn't had any such experience, was defiantly saying 'unless I see the holes the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe'.

Perhaps the real significance of today's Gospel story is that Jesus, the Risen Lord, will meet each of us wherever we are at. Jesus singled out Thomas in his lack of faith and met him exactly where he had placed himself. Look, Thomas 'put your finger here; look here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer, but believe.' Our honesty before the Lord and our openness to Him are each very important.

Psychologists have identified different levels of faith among members of the Christian community. The Lord in loving mercy towards all humanity will meet us at whatever level we're at to help us receive His love and respond, like Thomas, with faith. Very often it is our doubts and questions that allow the Lord to bring us to a deeper faith, just as Thomas' doubting was transformed into the strongest statement of faith we find in the Scriptures: **My Lord and My God.**
