# **Feast of Corpus Christi**

Some years ago now a great controversy arose in America when its Navy named a new nuclear submarine 'The Corpus Christi. The Church took umbrage that a war weapon should be called 'The Body of Christ'. It was eventually resolved when the navy agreed to name the ship, the 'City of Corpus Christi'. Corpus Christi is the name of a maritime city in Texas. It also holds a variety of meanings in a Christian context

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Eucharist, the Body of Christ, renewing what was also celebrated on Holy Thursday. It's as if so much is to be celebrated that day from a variety of perspectives that we return again to focus specifically on Christ present in the Eucharist.

The Latin words 'Corpus Christi' can also refer to the actual body of Jesus, born of Mary, and in time crucified. It refers also to the glorified body of the risen Lord that was experienced by many after the Resurrection

Finally, 'Corpus Christi' refers also to the Church itself, the Body of baptised believers. At your baptism we prayed that 'you may live always as a member of Christ's Body sharing everlasting life'. When Saul (later Paul), on his way to arrest Christians, was thrown from his horse, he heard a voice say 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me'. It brought home to him that in persecuting Christians he was persecuting the Body of Christ, the Corpus Christi.

'Corpus Christi'has layers of meaning and today's feast rejoices specifically in the gift of the Eucharist-Corpus Christi- the Body of Christ.

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi. For many of us it holds great memories of processions through the streets of parishes around the country. Here in our parish this year we are inviting 70 children who made their First Communion with us this year to come to the 10.30 Mass after which we will have a short procession to the lawn and celebrate Benediction. All are welcome.
