The Year of Luke

Every three years we read the Gospel of St. Luke at our Sunday Masses, as we do this year. It is helpful to think of St. Luke's Gospel as the first of two volumes, the second being The Acts of the Apostles. It is often recommended that we read the Gospel and Acts straight through, as though it were a novel. It gives insight into Luke's message. Whereas the other evangelists think of two periods in the history of salvation; that of the promise and that of Jesus with his Church, writing two volumes, Luke distinguishes the times in a better way: that of the promise, that of Jesus, and that of the Church.

- 1. The time of the promise: This is the time of the Old Testament and, for Luke, it comes to an end only with the 'Today' in the sermon at Nazareth (ch 4, v21), an account we read at next Sunday's Mass.
- 2. The time of Jesus: Luke uses material he receives from the tradition; the Gospel of Mark and source material of 'sayings of Jesus' which he shares with St. Matthew. However he arranges these skilfully by adding to them traditions peculiar to himself in order to present us with the divine plan as he sees it. Leaving aside the Nativity stories and the time of preparation and growing up, the itinerary of Jesus has three main stages:
- (a) The proclamation in Galilee of his paschal mystery (ch 4, 14 to 9.50).
- (b) The journey of Jesus up to Jerusalem towards his paschal mystery (ch 9.51to 19.28). This is the most original part of Luke's Gospel, and
- (c) Jesus fulfils the paschal mystery (ch. 19.29-24.53). On Easter Day Jesus shows himself alive to his disciples and ascends to heaven.

(d) The time of the church: Acts

The disciples are to be Jesus' witnesses in Jerusalem, Judaea and Samaria and to the ends of the world. The main figures in this development are Peter, the Greek speaking Hellenists, Paul but above all the Spirit and the Word of God

Dante rightly called St. Luke, 'the evangelist of God's tenderness'.
