Mary's Week in Advent

On this last Sunday of Advent the focus is firmly on Mary. In one of the classic reflections on Mary's life, Pope Paul V1 in February 1974 wrote the following in his document on Mary, 'Marialis Cultus.'

"The Virgin Mary has always been proposed to the faithful as an example to be imitated, not precisely in the type of life she led and much less for the sociocultural background in which she lived and which scarcely today exists anywhere.

Rather she is held up as an example to the faithful for the way in which in her own particular life she fully and responsibly accepted the will of God because she heard the word of God and acted on it, and because charity and the spirit of service were the driving force of her actions. She is worthy of imitation because she was the first and most perfect of Christ's disciples."

This last week of Advent sees us celebrate Mary more than at any other time in the year's liturgy.

Baptisms in January

Our next meeting in preparation for Baptisms to be celebrated in January will be held on Monday 30th December, at 8pm in the Parish Meeting Room.

The celebrations of Baptism in January will be on Sunday January 5^{th} and 19^{th} after the 12 noon Mass.

Parents are asked to please register with the Parish Office in advance of Monday 30^{th} and to attend the preparatory meeting.

Because it occasionally arises as a question, we confirm that godmother and godfather should be of each gender and that godparents must be over 16 and practising Catholics, at home in their faith. While normally we have two godparents, it is sufficient to have just one. Another may act as a witness rather than a godparent in that situation.

'Do this in Memory'

We thank the children preparing for First Communion and their parents who came to the 'Do This in Memory' Mass last Sunday. Between now and our next special Mass on January 26th, we ask parents to work with their children on the following pages of their Thumb book; pages 16 and 17 and then Kidstuff 4 on pages 48 to 53 of Thumbs. You'll notice that pages 50 to 53 offers an exercise for each of the 12 days of Christmas up to January 6th, the Feast of Epiphany. The pages of the newsletter, Grapevine 4, delivered this week offer further material to work on at home with the children. Between now and Christmas Eve the Advent Calendar on pages 46 and 47 of Thumbs invites ongoing colour-in work. Plenty of work for the Christmas time!

It's a pity to find a donation total that's only a couple of Euros short of $\[mathebox{\ensuremath{}}\]$ 250 when for the sake of a small amount, $\[mathebox{\ensuremath{}}\]$ 250 becomes $\[mathebox{\ensuremath{}}\]$ 362 with the benefit of a rebate. It's the sum total of Christmas and Easter dues along with the total in envelope collections, standing orders or recorded once off donations that counts.
