#### The Wheat and the Darnel

The darnel weed referred to in this parable of Jesus is one the Palestinian farmer was very familiar with. Like farmers the world over, they too tried to keep weeds at bay in their fields but this one had to be treated differently and its treatment becomes for Jesus an image of how the Kingdom of God unfolds in a world where good and bad live alongside each other daily.

The weed was known as 'the tares'; they were called 'bearded darnel' (Lolium temulentum – its botanical name). In their early stages of growth, they resembled wheat so closely that they couldn't be distinguished in the wheat field. When the heads appeared on both the wheat and the tares it became quite easy to distinguish them but by now the roots of the tares and wheat had become intertwined and the tares couldn't be weeded out without pulling the wheat as well. There was no choice for the farmer but to leave it grow together until harvest time and then separate out the wheat and the bearded darnel. It was important to do so because the bearded darnel is slightly poisonous. It causes dizziness and sickness and is narcotic in its effects besides having a bitter and unpleasant taste. It was separated by hand in Jesus' day. It was a laborious separation process usually undertaken by hired labour where grain was spread out on a large tray and the workers

hand picked the bearded darnel that was identified only by its slate-grey colour. Its size and shape were similar to the wheat.

When Jesus said that the Kingdom of God unfolded, much as the process used by farmers to grow wheat that was vulnerable to the tares or bearded darnel, what lessons might we learn from that? About the world around us? About judgement?
