

Mary's Month

May is traditionally devoted to Mary.

Between 1883 and 1889 Pope Leo X111 wrote a series of encyclical and apostolic letters on the Rosary. He was building on the work of a Jesuit in Rome named Fr. Latomia, who had the idea of devoting the entire month of May to Mary.

In Greek culture May was dedicated to the goddess Artemis and associated with new birth and new life. Roman culture linked May to Flora, the goddess of bloom and blossoms.

May is also seen in our culture as a season of motherhood in which mother earth brings out the full beauty of the blossom. The Spirit moves in us so that we can pray Mary's own prayer, The Magnificat, with love and joy in our hearts. Like Mary, we too rejoice and delight in God our Saviour:

'My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour.'

Our celebrations of First Communion these May weeks bring to many of us the memories of May processions led by First Communicants and our bringing garden flowers to school for the teacher's May altar. Bring flowers of the fairest,

Bring blossoms the rarest, from garden and woodland and hillside and dale.
Our full hearts are swelling Our glad voices telling the Praise of the loveliest flower of the May.

This weekend we rejoice with 44 girls who this Saturday have celebrated First Holy Communion.

We congratulate them, along with their parents and their teachers.

On June 23rd, the feast of Corpus Christi, we invite all the children who celebrated First Communion this year to the 12 noon Mass. It will be followed by a short procession onto the lawn, led by the First Communion children, where Benediction will be celebrated. It would be great to see 108 First Communicants leading the way.
