On July 3^{rd} we had the Peter's Pence collection and €100 donated on the machine went to that collection. 60% goes to the Common Fund (1sdt collection at Mass) and 40% to Share (2^{nd} collection). The diocese can avail of a tax break in respect of donations when the annual total exceeds €250 from an individual donor.

The Season of Creation

Next Thursday, September 1st, marks the beginning of what has come to be known as the Season of Creation. It ends on October 4th, the Feast Day of St Francis of Assisi. During these weeks, we are asked to enter into the spirit of Laudato Si', the first encyclical of Pope Francis, highlighting the critical importance of the care of the earth by all humanity.

The theme for this year's season is 'Listen to the Voice of Creation' and it takes its inspiration from the story of Moses and the Burning Bush. 'I have heard their cry...I know their sufferings... Come, now! I will send you... I will be with you' (Exodus 3:1-12)

The prevalence of unnatural fires in recent weeks is a sign of the devastating effects that climate change has brought on the most vulnerable on our planet. Creation cries out as forests burn, animals flee and people are forced to migrate. Record temperatures have shown that all regions and systems are affected and will render parts of the world uninhabitable for human beings. In contrast, the fire that called to Moses as he tended his flock did not destroy the bush. This flame of the Spirit revealed God's presence, listening to the cries of the suffering and promising to be with them and us as we follow in faith, to work for justice and for a more sustainable world.

Enrollment for the Sacraments.

Regardless of which school a child attends, the diocese now asks that everyone preparing to celebrate the sacraments of the Eucharist(1st), Reconciliation and Confirmation must register with his/her parish.
