Trinity Sunday

Immediately after our celebration of the Risen Christ in the Easter Season and of the Holy Spirit in last week's Pentecost, we pause to take stock of all that Jesus reveals to us of God. We have come to know God as the Blessed Trinity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit, through all that Jesus has made known to us. Indeed, if Jesus didn't speak of the Holy Spirit it's doubtful that we might know of its existence at all. But he did so clearly and invited his disciples to go to all the nations, teaching and baptising, in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Our baptism is our adoption as children of God. We might also see it as the great invitation to recognise our relationship with the Father, with Christ and with the Holy Spirit as the 'ground of our being', the bedrock of our existence and key to the meaning of our human lives. 'I bind unto myself today the strong name of the Trinity', in the words of the prayer of St Patrick.

We use the phrase 'in the name of' whenever we make the sign of the cross. It means 'in the person of'. I find my strength in life in the relationship I hold with the person of God the Father, with the person of Jesus, and with the person of the Holy Spirit, who dwells within us and between us.

'To whom shall we go', said St Peter to Jesus. 'You have the message of eternal life'.

Today we celebrate all that Jesus has made known to us about life and the love of God.
