The Cost of Living

The rising cost of electricity and gas will be monitored carefully by all of us and by the parish also in coming weeks and months. The move to LED lighting in the church last year was more timely than we realised, although we had anticipated saving expenses that are now outstripped by the fuel crisis. We may even have to consider closing the church earlier in the day if the cost of lighting the church becomes prohibitive.

Against a background of a sharp increase in the cost of living and the prospect of fuel poverty in many households, the words of today's Gospel passage from St Luke may seem out of place to us when Jesus says: 'None of you can be my disciple unless you give up all of your possessions'. Today, we may well wonder if our possessions are sufficient to meet the rising cost of living and if our world is not becoming one where, far from our freely giving up our possessions, we see possessions slipping away, taken from us.

Of course, Jesus is telling us that following him is never a matter to be taken lightly. We have to weigh carefully the cost of discipleship. To take the Gospel call to heart is a challenge beyond this world's terms and is enabled only by the Holy Spirit.

Season of Creation

Throughout September until the feast of St Francis on Oct 4th we're invited to celebrate the Season of Creation as a time of responding to Pope Francis' invitation to listen to the cry of the earth and to the cry of the poor. Here are some suggestions for this week from Trócaire's list of what we might undertake. We'll continue that list through the five Sundays of the Season of Creation.

- Look up the Laudato Si' Action Platform and see how your family, school, parish or business might achieve the Laudato Si' Goals by 2030: <u>www.laudatosiactionplatform.org</u>
- Spend some time outside each day, in awareness, reconnect with nature
- Pray in and with nature-encourage Laudato Si' themed gardens in your parish; bless an area in the church grounds specifically for outdoor meditation or prayer.
- Organise a parish clean up, beach clean up, river clean up during the Season of Creation.
- Check out the Faith Community Pollinator Plan and explore its possibilities in the parish. Local schools and groups could help. <u>https://pollinators.ie/communities/faithcommunities/</u>
- Start to grow some of your own food, support local producers
- Compost your garden and food waste; in the parish too.
