The Epiphany and the Baptism of our Lord

Yesterday's Feast of Epiphany and today's Feast of the Baptism of our
Lord bring to a close the great seasonal celebration of the birth of Jesus,
our God becoming one of us to help us, reassure us and lead us to
salvation. Tomorrow we return to 'Ordinary Time'.

Before we return we resolve to take the message of this season with us
into everyday life.

Our human nature is lifted greatly by the assurance that, in Jesus, our God
became one of us. It is a measure of how deeply God loves us that he sent
his Son into our world, "not to condemn the world" but "so that we could
have life through him". That gift of life is there for all humanity and we
experience it as something ongoing, nurtured by Christ's presence in the
sacraments and in prayer. We journey with him.

There is a lovely international flavour to the Season of Epiphany. The
Magi represent all who, across the nations, are honest seekers after truth.
Their search was fulfilled in the discovery of Jesus. In his Baptism by
John, which closes the Epiphany season, Jesus identifies with all humanity
by entering the waters of the Jordan. In our Baptism we identify with him,
his vision and his way of being in our world.

Celebrating Baptism

Our next meeting in preparation for Baptisms to be celebrated in February will be held on Monday, 29th January, at 8pm in the Parish Meeting Room.

The celebrations of Baptism in February will be on Sundays February 4th and 18th, after the 12 noon Mass. Parents are asked to please register with the Parish Office in advance of Monday 29th January and to attend the preparatory meeting.

Because it occasionally arises as a question, we confirm that godmother and godfather should be of each gender and that godparents must be over 16 and practising Catholics, at home in their faith. While normally we have two godparents, it is sufficient to have just one. Another may act as a witness rather than a godparent in that situation.
