World Meeting of Families 2018

As thoughts turn to the visit of Pope Francis in two months time, it may be timely to remind parishioners that tickets will be needed to attend the Mass in the Phoenix Park on August 26th. Next Friday, 22nd June is a date from which tickets are to be accessed by internet. Tickets are free but are necessary because of restrictions on the numbers entering the Phoenix Park that day, restrictions based on concerns for safety and security.

While the Pastoral Council had expressed hopes of providing a service to parishioners to facilitate their receipt of tickets, at its recent meeting it emerged that the logistics involved were complicated. Those familiar with the internet, who have an e-mail address, should have no difficulty accessing the website WMOF2018.ie themselves and we'd ask those not familiar with it to seek the help of a family member or friend to assist their pursuit of the necessary ticket. Tickets will be downloaded at the e-mail address given by the applicant. While in theory tickets for the concert in Croke Park are also available online, it is very likely that with a limited capacity of 30,000 that Saturday evening, 25th August, tickets may be sold out or hard to come by. Don't delay if you hope to be in the Park that day.

The third national Church collection towards the cost of hosting the World Meeting of Families will be taken up at all Masses this weekend in place of the Share collection.

Next weekend the World Meeting of Families Office is sending a speaker to us to advance the need for more volunteers and more host families to serve this significant event.

Walking into Eternity on Sandymount Strand

It's that Bloomsday time of year again, when the stretch of coastline from Dalkey to Sandymount and elsewhere in the city, sees a multiple celebration of James Joyce's Dublin.

We thank the wonderful team at the Iris Charles Centre for the Bloomsday breakfast they organised again this year and Rodney Devitt for the walkabout to Sandymount's Joycean connections. Thanks too to the enthusiasm of all who don the style of a hundred years ago to mark the occasion, recite the poems and sing the songs of the day.

Community celebration of our city and its people is always to be encouraged, whether it's around its literature, its football, its history and its faith.

Joyce included that faith story when intertwined in the broad matrix of life, he gave place to Jesuits or to the men's temperance retreat at Star of the Sea Church when Canon John O'Hanlon assisted by his curate, Fr. Conroy and the preacher, Fr. John Hughes, S.J. led Benediction and sounds of Tantum Ergo drafted over the strand.

The original Bloomsday was 16th June 1904 the day on which the novel Ulysses was set. Canon O'Hanlon died on 15th May 1905 at the age of 84. But on 16th June 1904 Canon O'Hanlon was quite ill and unlikely to have played the part assigned to him in the novel. That said, Joyce was meticulous in his preparation down to writing from Zurich to his aunt living in Sandymount for an account of the trees on the grounds of Star of the Sea.

Father's Day was designated in 1966 by President Lyndon B. Johnson as taking place on the 3rd Sunday of June. In doing so he was following a tradition going back to 1910 in America. Whereas countries on this side of the Atlantic chose the 4th Sunday of Lent as Mother's Day and so differed from the American choice of the second Sunday of May, it seems that when it came to Father's Day we simply ran with the established American date of celebration.
