What are we doing for Lent?

When a young girl asked me what I was doing for Lent a couple of weeks ago I had little awareness of what was facing all of us within a few days – frequent hand washing, and no touching the face, keeping a social distance of two metres, large numbers of people out of work, all schools and universities closed and the prospect that weeks if not months are ahead of us in tight discipline if we are to confront this deadly virus successfully. We can do it!

The reports of what's happening in Italy and Spain are frightening and we pray that our efforts will prove sufficient. We pray for our doctors and nurses and all frontline workers, for medical scientists around the world in pursuit of a successful vaccine, for politicians charged with critical national leadership decisions and for people everywhere who are affected by this dreadful virus.

'What are you doing for Lent, Father'. We're all upping the gear on that one, hopefully together in all that's asked of us. Meanwhile the hope of Easter beckons our courage, our looking out for one another and especially for the vulnerable. There is a light that shines in our darkness and the darkness will not overcome it'. God bless everyone in these trying times.

Webcam Mass – a change

While the webcam 10.30am Mass on last Sunday and St. Patrick's Day both transmitted very well, the corresponding celebrations at 12 noon on both days unfortunately did not. We are experiencing an internet crash every day for about 15 minutes that begins at around 12.15pm. We don't know why it is so and are awaiting the server's technical help on it.

Apologies to all who were disappointed. We'll schedule Mass this Sunday for 10.30am and the **later time of 12.30pm.** We'll start when we see the 'blip' as having passed us by so if it's a little later than 12.30pm it's because we're awaiting clearance! So there was Fr. Cormac on Sunday and Fr. John on St. Patrick's Day talking and praying alone in an empty church, unaware that apart from God nobody else was able to listen. Our thanks to Deirdre Seaver who played at both Masses on St. Patrick's Day.

So remember webcam at 10.30am and 12.30pm this Sunday.

At the daily 7.30am and 10.00am Masses could we ask for a special effort to maintain a necessary social distance particularly in coming to Communion. Two metres is hard to picture; think of 6ft. instead. In addition, use the space provided by respecting the seat assignments in the church pews, 3 per every second seat in the centre aisles, 2 per every second seat on the side aisles. That allows seating for 100, the present maximum gathering – unless that changes before Sunday. In the event of a funeral allow the family and close friends their priority and respect the absolute requirement of social distancing and the maximum permitted number allowed.
