Catholic Schools Week

This coming week is Catholic Schools Week, a week in which we celebrate our schools for their significance and importance in our lives. A school with Catholic ethos will uphold important values in education.

The first of these is the valuing and appreciation of how precious each person's life is. Regardless of race, creed or social standing the Catholic school will uphold and respect the dignity of each person, 'made in the image and likeness of God.'

The second is that the school is a community of people, students, teachers and parents who work together supportively in relationships guided by Christian values – a community of love, peace and joy, a community of understanding and forgiveness, a community that fosters care and concern for the vulnerable and poor. As one principal teacher puts it – 'our school is our parish.'

A third feature is that a Catholic school prepares students for the whole of life's journey. That's why its curriculum will be seen to embrace both knowledge and faith and why growth in virtue will be prized as much and more than growth in academic achievement. The ecumenical spirit and the desire to be in peaceful harmony with members of other religions means that non Christian students will be respected within its faith dimension. The Catholic faith will be celebrated with respectful recognition of the faith journeys

of others.

Finally, the Catholic school will seek to prepare its students to meet the modern world as adults who are educated across the arts and sciences in what one great philosopher called 'the funded capital of civilization.' Perhaps it's fair to say that this is often the only evaluative measure that some bring to the Catholic school. Catholic schools around the world are prized for academic achievement of students but it's important to see the wider picture of schools' purpose and endeavour.

This year the theme for Catholic Schools Week is "Catholic Schools: Living in Harmony with God's Creation." The theme encourages us to see that we all have a responsibility to care for the earth, not just for our own future, but for the future of every one of God's creatures.

Our local Catholic schools will hold special celebrations this week in Marian College and in Scoil Mhuire and Star of the Sea Primary Schools. We're delighted too that girls from Scoil Mhuire will sing in the Laudate Festival along with other schools at the Church in Ballyroan (Holy Spirit) next Wednesday at 7.00pm.

The boys in Marian College will also participate in the Emmanuel Festival at the Helix, DCU on March 11th.
