Starting up Again

As we ease our way back into bringing life to the faith community that gathers in Star of the Sea, we know only too well that we're not back to normal life for awhile yet. We return in this coming week very much reliant on everyone's sense of responsibility, on the support of volunteers to act as stewards and church cleaners, on high regard for each others' safety and ready to accept whatever limitations are imposed by the HSE and Government regulations.

Be resolved to maintain the hand washing discipline, to avoid touching of the face, to maintain the 2 metres distance from all but those in your own household. Wear a mask, if possible. The virus is out there still, lurking like a sniper and it's a deadly virus but with careful precaution we can keep it at bay and keep one another safe.

When you come to Mass, after sanitizing, go to where the steward invites you to sit. It will be helpful to fill up the available seats in a way that enables an easy count of spaces available. When the church is full to the permitted level accept that as a fact with understanding. Consider coming on another day and know that the webcam offers a connection for all who have internet facility at home.

We ask you to stay in the assigned seat and not move to light candles or purchase newspapers / magazines, for example. It may be possible to come at another time in the day to do so.

At communion time, our movement will be different in that one Eucharistic Minister will distribute communion at the top of the centre aisle and another half way down the centre aisle where a gap opens between seats on both centre and side aisles to allow ease of movement. To avoid meeting others coming and going, there will be a circular movement made in four different areas of the church which will be explained when we gather and will rely on stewards' directions. Such changes are in the interest of everyone's greater safety.

We won't sing hymns as yet. To do so risks a situation where 2 metres distancing may not be sufficient for safety.

The main door will be the only entrance if the total number allowed entry remains at 50. The two side aisle doors towards the front will be our only exit doors. Baskets will be left at both exit doors inviting contributions for both the Common Fund and Share Fund collections. As people leave they might have donations ready so as not to delay proceedings. Keep the 2 metres distancing as you leave and maintain the flow onwards.

The church will close after each Mass to allow the team of cleaners to sanitize the seats. We anticipate two persons cleaning when attendance is capped at 50. When the number increases at the Government's discretion we'll need more than two. It is anticipated that we'll need five stewards at each Mass initially to assist the new discipline and welcome the return of the congregation. We thank all who have kindly volunteered.

The daily Mass at 7.30am and 10.00am resumes this Monday.

A meeting will be held for volunteers on Thursday next at 7.30pm in the church. Eucharistic Ministers are invited to meet on Saturday next at 12 noon in the church. Over the summer months, people will likely be away on holidays and we'll be needing replacement help for all volunteers on holidays. We're very grateful to all who have already volunteered to help.
