### Our Irishtown Connection

Some parishioners have expressed surprise that the local authority's 'Welcome to Sandymount' sign is placed where it is, to the front left of the Church on Sandymount Road. They expected it to be further towards Ringsend. Perhaps the answer lies in the fact that when Star of the Sea was constructed in 1853, care was taken that it should lie within the boundary of 'Irishtown'. It was after all replacing 'Irishtown Chapel', which had served the Catholic community for 200 years and dated back to the time of Charles 11. It was located at the site of the old police station close to Chapel Avenue in Irishtown. So it was that 'Star of the Sea' was known as Irishtown Church until it was constituted as Sandymount Parish Church in 1875.

That link with Irishtown is a proud one. Around 1454 the native Irish population was expelled from Dublin city and was only allowed to trade inside the Dublin city limits by daylight. At the end of the day's trading they had to leave and set up camp in what was to become known as Irishtown. Irishtown later became part of the Pembroke Urban District.

Two interesting spots in Irishtown are the Pigeon House and the Waxies' Dargle.

The Pigeon House gets its name from John Pidgeon. Around 1760 he was a caretaker of a storehouse used by the builders of the Great South Wall. He started selling refreshments, tea, cakes and lemonade at his storehouse to passengers of the packet ships arriving from England and Europe.

The Waxies Dargle, on the other hand, was the location of an annual outing of Dublin cobblers (waxies') in the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century. While the gentry went to Bray, and its Dargle river, the waxies settled for Irishtown – the Waxie's Dargle.
