On-Line Donations

Currently the fees charged by AIB Merchant Bank for donations on line are 0.8% if you use a credit card and 0.4% if a debit card is used. We will keep you posted on a monthly basis on whatever charges are involved. In some cases it may be to our advantage if donations are made by cheque instead. An advantage of donation on line is that it records your name and facilitates access to a tax rebate. It really helps when people in generosity donate to church funds if they share their name with us in doing so. In recent years the rebate benefit to the Parish has been as much as €25,000 per annum and a major factor in the running of the Parish.

The Parish Feast Day

Next Saturday, August 15th, is the Feast of the Assumption, our parish feastday. It was on August 15th in 1853 that the church was dedicated by Archbishop Cullen, although it took some further years to complete. Initially, St. Mary's Star of the Sea was part of the wider parish of Irishtown, Donnybrook and Ringsend and it wasn't until 1876 that Sandymount, or Irishtown, became a separate parish.

The teaching of the Assumption came under attack in the Reformation and was all the more cherished by the Catholic faithful. While there is no explicit description of Mary's Assumption in the Scriptures, as there is of Christ's Ascension, from the early centuries of the church this feast of Mary has been celebrated. You can read the sermons of John Damascene or of Germanus of Constantinople preached on the Feast of the Assumption and note that from the 2nd century onwards Our Lady was identified as the second Eve by the Fathers of the Church. In the words of Pope Pius X11: 'in the last resort these Fathers base their conclusions on the Bible, which has given us the picture of Our Lord's mother as inseparably attached to her divine Son and constantly sharing his lot.'

On August 15th as the Church in the West celebrates the Assumption, the Orthodox Church in the East celebrates the Dormition. The Dormition is Mary's falling asleep in the Lord. These are two different ways of perceiving the same event. They both celebrate the fulfilment in a human being, one of us, of God's loving purpose for all of us. "Blessed is she who hears the Word of God and keeps it."

Next Saturday, we celebrate the life of our parish dedicated to Mary, Star of the Sea, with gratitude for the generations of men and women who have built it, shared it and passed it on to us.
