World Day of the Sick

This Tuesday, February 11th, the Feastday of Our Lady of Lourdes is World Day of the Sick. 'Come to me all you who labour and are burdened' is the theme that Pope Francis chose for 2020. In his letter, to mark this 28th World Day of the Sick, he is urging the human warmth and personalised approach of Christ, the Good Samaritan, in health professionals, workers and volunteers. The mercy and comforting presence of Jesus, he says, embraces people in their entirety, each person in his or her health condition, discarding no one, but rather inviting everyone to share in His life and to experience His tender love. Only those who personally experienced suffering, he argues, are able to comfort others. Christ comforts because in his human suffering he received comfort from His Father.

In our country we are indebted to many wonderful health professionals doing their best, often in trying circumstances. We've become used also to trolleys and to a clinical approach capable of falling short in personal dimensions. I recall visiting a patient who in response to a simple – 'How are you today?' greeting, said - 'Today, I'm over the moon, I've met a human being in here'. Someone amid all the pressures had taken time to speak to him at a personal level and it was appreciated. Pope Francis touches on that when he writes -'What is needed is a personalised approach to the sick, not just of curing but also of caring, in view of an integral human healing'. In addition to therapy and support, he says, they expect care and attention - 'in a word, love'. At the side of every sick person, there is also a family, which itself suffers and is support and comfort. in need of

In serving the ill, Pope Francis urges healthcare professionals that the noun 'person' takes priority over the adjective 'sick'. He urges them to "always strive to promote the dignity and life of each person, and reject any compromise in the direction of euthanasia, assisted suicide or suppression of life, even in the case of terminal illness." "Life is sacred and belongs to God; hence it is inviolable and no one can claim the right to dispose of it freely".

The Pope laments the attacks on healthcare workers during wars and violent conflicts and in some areas the attempt of political authorities to manipulate medical care for their own advantage. Noting too that across the world many have "no access to medical care because they live in poverty", he urges government leaders not to neglect social justice.

He concludes by thanking all healthcare volunteers who serve the sick, often compensating for structural shortcomings, while reflecting the image of Christ, the Good Samaritan, by their acts of tender love and closeness.
