<u>World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly</u> <u>-`In old age they will still bear fruit'- July</u> <u>24th this year</u>

Pope Francis' recently issued a message for the celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. The World Day will take place on Sunday 24 July with the theme *In old age they will still bear fruit (Psalm* 92:15). The central theme of the message is to promote dialogue among the generations, especially between grandparents and grandchildren and to bring together the wisdom of the elderly and the enthusiasm of the young.

The World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly was celebrated for the first time in 2021 as one of the fruits of the *Amoris Laetitia* Family Year. Parishes are encouraged to celebrate this special day.

<u>Trócaire – one person to die from hunger</u> every 48 seconds in the Horn of Africa

Trócaire has advised the Irish bishops' conference of the devastating impact that climate change is having on the countries in which it works, with the Horn of Africa facing its fourth consecutive year of drought. In Somalia, Kenya and Ethiopia one person is likely to die from hunger every 48 seconds, while approximately 5.7 million children are acutely malnourished. The United Nations warns that 350,000 children could die by the autumn unless action is taken.

The threat of famine is due to the continual failure to address the lethal combination of climate change, conflict and the economic consequences of the Covid-19 pandemic, which have left the region in extreme crisis. This has been exacerbated by the disruption of the global economy and food systems as a result of war in Ukraine, with fuel and food prices spiralling. Bishops call on Government, and the international community, to act immediately to end this hunger crisis, which may be achievable if a concerted effort is made now.

First Friday

Next Friday is the First Friday of the month. Masses will be offered for all whose names are on the November list of the dead. It is a day also when we bring Holy Communion to those who are housebound through age or illness in the parish. Because of Covid the numbers on our visitation list dropped understandably. If people wish to be renewed on that list or wish to be placed on it for the future, please let us know.
