From Ashes to Easter

On Wednesday next, with ashes on our foreheads we begin the sacred journey of Lent. You might see it as a journey with Jesus amid all the cares and opportunities of the modern world.

Next Sunday we'll begin our journey in the wilderness (Mt 4: 1–11). The following Sunday we travel with him to the top of a mountain (Mt: 17: 1–19). As we walk with him along the road on the following Sundays we will meet interesting people Jesus encounters; the woman at the well (John 4:5–42), a blind man (John 9:1-41) and then Martha, Mary and their brother Lazarus (John 11:1-45) before our entry into Jerusalem (Mt 21:1-11) and the story of the Passion and Death of Jesus (Mt 26:14-27,66) until on the 7th Sunday, Easter Day, we rejoice in his resurrection (John 20:1-9).

Each of these Sundays allows us to reflect on our own human journey in the company of Jesus. If we can weave our own journey and Jesus' journey together, it will bring us into closer union with God.

That is the purpose of our journey from ashes to Easter with the Lord, who leads and saves us.

TURKEY & SYRIA Earthquake

As the death toll continues to climb from the devastating earthquakes in Turkey and Syria, desperate, grieving survivors have been left homeless and injured with no food and no shelter in freezing sub-zero cold. Archbishop Farrell has given approval for a diocesan collection to be taken up in support of the people of Turkey and Syria affected by the devastating earthquakes on Monday 5th February. The Turkey/Syria Collection will take place on 25/26 February, at 1st Sunday of Lent celebrations, and will replace the SHARE collection. The collection will be channelled through Trócaire, who are working with partners in the affected area. They have the capability to ensure that any funds raised in Ireland will be managed appropriately to meet the needs of those most badly affected. Please support.
